INVITE...GROW...SERVE PASTOR TO PARSONS

Since they would not accept my advice and spurned my rebuke, they will eat the fruit of their ways and be filled with the fruit of their schemes. For the waywardness of the simple will kill them, and the complacency of fool will destroy them, but whoever listens to me will live in safety and be at ease without fear harm.”
~ Proverbs 1:30-33

There are many times when we forget about the consequences of our actions. We speed without thinking, and then we get a speeding ticket or get in an accident. We are in a hurry, and the slow drivers in front of us are causing us to be late even though we left 10 minutes later than we should have. We will blame other people instead of accepting the consequences of our actions.

At the end of the first chapter of Proverbs, Solomon states that wisdom will be hard to find when we are in trouble and looking for answers because we didn't take the time to seek wisdom first. We understand we wouldn't have to speed if we left on time.

A part of us wants to believe our complex lives do not align with Solomon's warnings. We can use the internet to find the answers to get out of trouble. The issue is that we could have avoided the problem in the first place if we had sought wisdom first. Our common excuse is that we didn't have time to seek wisdom first. Let's go back to the first part of Chapter 1. The "fear" of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom. The word fear, in this instance, means reverence or awe. If we take the time to seek God first, then we will begin to understand wisdom. The more we seek God, the more wisdom we gain.

In a recent conversation, I half-jokingly said that my discernment gauge was broken. It seems that half the time, I am sensing God's voice. I think it is because I am a little slow in understanding, but the reality is that I am not seeking God first in some of those decisions. I am not diligently taking the time to pray for God's will in those moments. I am trying to do it on my own instead of taking the extra few minutes to ask God for his direction and input.

The consequences have not been the most pleasant, but they are lessons that need to be learned. Solomon taught this thousands of years ago: seek wisdom while it can be found. So, take the time to seek God and His wisdom in all circumstances. You seek God through prayer, study, and talking with believers.

We praise God that since OCC started in 1993 over **232** million children in over 170 countries and territories have received shoebox gifts and have had *The Greatest Gift*, Jesus, presented to them. Since 2009, **40.5 million** have gone on to enroll in *The Greatest Journey* discipleship program with **20.3 million** making decisions for Christ. It is estimated that for every child who accepts Christ through OCC, **7 to 9** family members and friends also accept Christ! What an eternal impact for our investment! It's also encouraging to see how this shoebox program gets our local kids excited about missions and evangelism. If you participated in our packing party you saw this firsthand!

Eagle Brand Bread Pudding

Ingredients

6 cup French bread cubes or any bread you like.
6 large eggs
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1 teaspoon ground nutmeg
2 cup milk
2(14 ounce) can Eagle Brand® Sweetened Condensed Milk
1/2 cup butter, melted
2 teaspoon vanilla extract
Optional: 4 cups if fresh or frozen fruit

Instructions

HEAT oven to 350°F. Spray a 9 X 13-inch baking pan with no-stick spray. Place bread cubes into prepared baking pan. Mix well.

BAKE 45 to 50 minutes or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Cool slightly and serve warm.

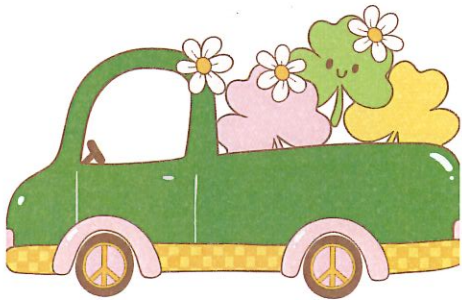
Eagle Brand Sauce

2 tsp vanilla extract or vanilla bean paste

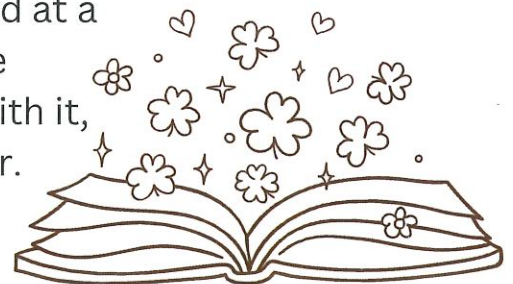
Instructions

Cook sauce. Add the sweetened condensed milk, butter, and hot water to a medium-sized, heavy-bottom saucepan. Cook over medium heat until the butter has melted and everything is well combined. This step will take 4 to 6 minutes.
Add vanilla. Take the saucepan off the heat and stir in the vanilla bean paste or vanilla extract. Adjust consistency (optional). If you'd like to thin the sauce out, stir hot water into the sauce, 1 tablespoon at a time, until the texture is to your liking.
Serve. Enjoy the sauce warm and pour it over bread pudding, pancakes, waffles, French toast, ice cream, and any desserts your heart desires.

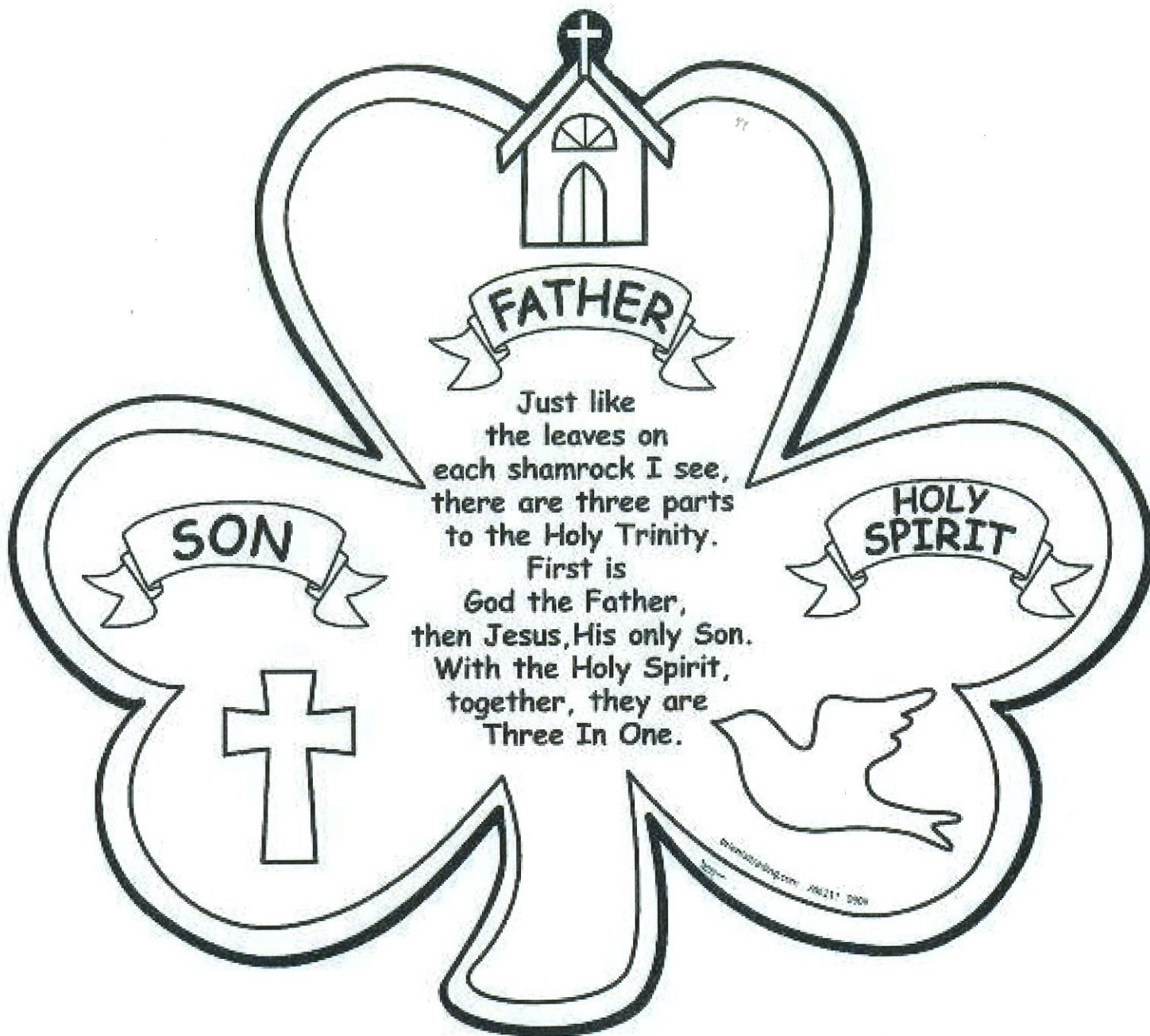

ZION METHODIST COMMUNITY CHURCH VALENTINES SNOW-BALL DANCE FOR SPECIAL NEEDS

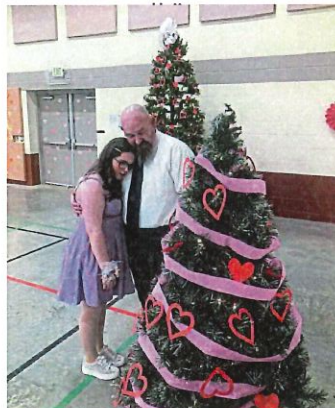

Buffalo Township's John Hughes, clad in a red-and-white, heart-covered Hawaiian shirt, went to Zion Methodist Church with a mission Saturday night. "I'm just here to dance and have fun and hang out with my friends," said Hughes, 25, a native of the township's Sarver neighborhood and a Freeport Area High School grad. Mission accomplished as Hughes and about 100 others took to the dance floor to celebrate the church's inaugural Valentine Snowball, a semiformal dance for young people 14 and up with special needs and their care providers. Hughes has autism and an intellectual disability. Nothing hindered him from mingling and getting into the groove "A lot of these wonderful kids don't have anywhere to go that is kind of fancy like this," said Hughes' mother, Bobbie Hughes. Many attendees were seeing the world through rose-colored glasses as organizers handed out heart-shaped sunglasses with red lenses. Rachel Bricker, 23, of Freeport was dressed for the occasion with a red sequin dress, red heart earrings and purple and red bracelets. Her mother, Lindi Bricker, styled her hair. Rachel has a genetic disorder that causes multiple involuntary movements. Lindi Bricker said the family loved the dance and the food provided. "It's just awesome," she said. "It's wonderful for everybody to get together. Rachel was really looking forward to coming and seeing everybody." Rachel Bricker is a former student of Becky Ross, a retired Freeport Area elementary special education teacher and Valentine Snowball coordinator. Ross said it was great to see a lot of familiar faces brave Saturday evening's inclement weather to attend the event. "It's neat for me because a lot of these young adults that are coming, I had in kindergarten. It's so cool to see them and get to dance with them and have fun," Ross said.



At least 60 volunteers, including some attendees, helped with setup and decorations for the event. Ross' husband, Bill Ross, and his friend Jeff Cox greeted attendees in the church parking lot while holding umbrellas. Some Freeport Area High School Key Club members distributed food and drinks while others set up a salon at the church to do hair, makeup and nails. Freeport Area freshmen Emma Charlton and Ava Abbott helped in the salon. "The salon was a really good environment for all of our special-needs and life-skills community, and I think that everyone here is just really sweet," Charlton said. "Doing this is an amazing way to give back to our community and really show how much we care about everybody." About 20 attendees came to the salon. "We don't have experience, but we figured it out," Charlton said. "It's a very rewarding feeling," Abbott added. "It's a very helpful way to help others and a very good way to give back. It's very fun

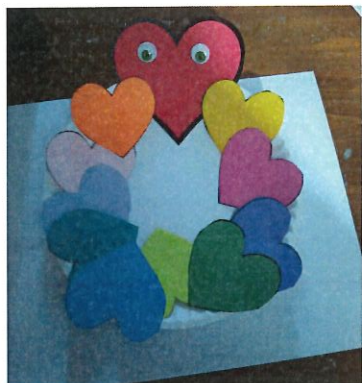


Natalie Pollino, a Freeport Area High School life skills teacher, was among school district staffers who volunteered at the event.
