INVITE...GROW...SERVE

Then you will understand what is right and just and fair—every good path. For wisdom will enter your heart, and knowledge will be pleasant to your soul. Discretion will protect you, and understanding will guard you. ~ Proverbs 2:9-11

What does wisdom look like? I heard one definition of wisdom as applying knowledge in our lives. Another way of understanding wisdom is putting into practice the knowledge that we have.

The start of chapter two of Proverbs helps us understand this definition a little better. Solomon speaks to his son about the words he is sharing and tells him not only to listen but also to store these words in his heart. He then takes it one step further by telling him to apply these lessons to his life. When the son does this, he will understand what is right, just, and fair.

The same holds true for us today. If we want wisdom, we must pursue it and apply it to our lives. We cannot just read about it and let it sit there. We need to apply it. How do we apply it?


First, let us be sure that we are looking for wisdom. Proverbs is a good place to start. The Gospels are another good place to find wisdom. In Psalm 119, David says the word of God is the place to find the truth, and when we meditate on it, our lives will be changed. So, the first step is to seek out wisdom.

The next step is to put it into practice. Jesus says to forgive others. If we are wise, we will need to apply forgiveness in our daily lives. We will need to release the person from the sin they committed against us instead of holding that grudge. This takes time, repetition, and humility on our part. As we grow in wisdom, we can see the good path that Solomon shows his son. We know the right words to say because we share the words we read in the Word of God and live out those words in our daily lives.

What happens when we gain wisdom? Solomon says our understanding will guard us, and discretion will protect us. What does he mean? He means that as we understand God's words, we will know what to do and what not to do. We will know what to say and what not to say because we put God's words into practice. Will we mess up? Yes, we will, but God will correct us and lead us to be better.

I hope and pray that we can be wise like Solomon and forgive each other as we put into practice what we learn.

ZION RECIPE

This months recipe came from the Easter Breakfast !!

PUMPKIN CHEESECAKE BAKED OATMEAL

Prep Time:25 mins Cook Time:35 mins Total Time 1 Hr.



INGREDIENTS:

- 2 1/4 cups quick oats
- 2/3 cup brown sugar
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1 tsp pumpkin pie spice
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1 lg egg, lightly beaten
- 1 cup pumpkin puree
- 1 cup milk, (any variety works)
- 1/3 cup canola oil (or melted butter or coconut oil)
- 2 tsp vanilla extract
- 8 ounces cream cheese (or mascarpone cheese)
- 1 TBSP maple syrup
- 2/3 cup toasted pecans, coarsely chopped
- heavy cream, for serving (optional)

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Preheat the oven to 350 degrees f. Spray a 9X9 inch baking dish with nonstick spray.
2. In a large bowl, whisk together the oats, sugar, baking powder, pumpkin spice, and salt. in a smaller bowl, whisk together the eggs, pumpkin, milk, oil, and vanilla extract. Add the wet ingredients to the dry and stir until combined. Pour the mixture in the dish..
3. In a small bowl. stir together the cream cheese and maple syrup until combined. Don't worry it gets thicker. Dollop the cheese all over the top of the oatmeal. Use a spatula to gently press it in and swirl it around a bit.
4. Bake for 30 to 35 minutes, or until the top is golden brown and set. Remove the dish from the oven and let cool for a few minutes. Top with the toasted pecans. Scoop or slice and serve. Drizzle with cream if desired.
