PERSON TO PERSON

My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline, and do not resent his rebuke, because the Lord disciplines those he loves, as a father the son he delights in.

Proverbs 3:11-12

Discipline is hard. If you have ever tried to diet, you know how hard it is to be disciplined. The foods that we love are usually the ones that are unhealthy for us. If diet is easy for you, another discipline is exercise. It is tough to be disciplined when your muscles are sore and everything hurts. It is easy to skip the jog when it is raining. Discipline is hard.


We understand how hard discipline is, but what does it mean? Oxford defines discipline as the practice of training people to obey rules or a code of behavior, using punishment to correct disobedience. Many of us understand this definition, as we grew up, our parents used discipline to correct our behavior.

When we did something wrong, we were punished. Proverbs 3:11-12 gives us an insight into God's heart. God wants the best for us, and sometimes it is hard to see God's heart in our situations. This is where our disciplines come into play. The discipline of prayer, scripture reading, and worship reminds us that God is with us and wants the best for us. This discipline may not be what Solomon intended when he shared Proverbs 3:11-12. Solomon most likely

meant God's discipline to correct his son's behavior. Correcting bad behavior can build resentment towards the one providing the correction. How many times have we been angry with our parents for correcting us? You may have said something like, "I hate you!" or "I wish you weren't my parent!" What about when it's God that provides the correction? Do we hate God? Do we stop listening? Do the seeds of resentment get planted?

Solomon reminds his son to accept God's correction. How do we do that? It starts with being open to what God is saying. 1 John 1:4 says to test the spirit to see if God sent it. How do we test it? Does the word, feeling, impression, or whatever you think God is sharing with you point towards Jesus being the Son of God, Messiah, Redeemer, and Savior? Then it is from God. As God disciplines us, it is to bring us into the right relationship with God that we once had. God desires the best for us. God desires a relationship with us. God provides everything we need to be with Him. So, as Solomon told his son, "My son, do not despise the Lord's discipline, and do not resent his rebuke, because the Lord disciplines those he loves, as a father the son he delights in." May we heed this proverb and trust God knows what He is doing.



ZION RECIPE

Easy Chicken Alfredo

2 boneless chicken breasts, cubed

1 tablespoon minced onion

1 tablespoon minced garlic

1teaspoon salt & pepper

1 teaspoon garlic & onion powder

1 tablespoon olive oil

2 cups penne pasta (or pasta of your choice)

1 jar Bertolli Alfredo Sauce

Parmesan Cheese

Put a pot of water on to boil with a tablespoon of salt for your pasta on high heat.

In a medium pan on low, place the Bertoli Sauce to heat.

In a skillet, heat olive oil, minced onion, and garlic. Season chicken breasts with salt, pepper, garlic powder, and onion powder. Sauté chicken until fully cooked. Then add the Bertolli sauce to the skillet and set aside to warm until the pasta is done. Place pasta in boiling water, bring back up to a boil for 10 to 20 minutes or until the pasta is al dente. Drain the pasta back into the pot, pour the chicken alfredo sauce into the pasta mix unit; everything is saturated, serve on a dish and top with parmesan cheese, eat and enjoy.
