Power of a Handshake

On Sunday mornings when pastor tells you to extend a greeting to those around you, what do you do? Do you wave at the person in the next pew? Do you extend a "fist bump"? Do you nod your head while saying hello? Possibly "yes" to all three. But chances are you offer a handshake. Prior to 2020, the handshake was almost a given, but since Covid, the chances have slipped slightly. But I would guess the handshake still tops the percentage list. Do you know the origin of where the handshake came from? Neither did I till I looked it up. The handshake originated thousands of years ago as a gesture of peace and trust. First documented in ancient Assyria in the 9th century BCE and practiced in ancient Greece and Rome. It originally served to show that neither person was carrying a weapon, with the up-and-down motion intended to dislodge any hidden daggers. The practice later evolved to symbolize friendship, alliance, and the sealing of promises. But I would like to discuss how it can mean something far more powerful, and important.

Every December the Brotherhood schedules mini concerts at the local nursing homes in our area.

We end up singing for approximately 45 minutes every Wednesday, leading up to Christmas. Depending on the nursing home we visit, our audience ranges from 15 to 30 people. After we sing, members of the Brotherhood will walk through the audience and thank the residents for coming and wish them a Merry Christmas. At the same time, we will shake their hands. At that moment, something very special occurs. A connection is made. I do not know how long these individuals have been in this nursing facility, or how many people come to visit them regularly but in that moment of the handshake, they feel respected, honored, and loved. As I shake one resident's hand and wish them a Merry Christmas, I see the next individual lifting their arm, preparing to greet me. I am sure that these folks enjoyed our performance and the music of the season, but I feel that one-on-one interaction, that handshake, is an even greater holiday gift. My handshake is not healing them physically, as Jesus healed the woman in Mark 5, but there is a certain power in the moment that is happening. Perhaps a healing from the feelings of loneliness and neglect. An honoring of an individual who has felt too alone for quite some time. A sharing of God's love in a quick moment of human contact. A feeling of Christmas! I challenge you this Christmas season to place yourselves in a similar environment. Visit someone in a nursing home, a hospital, or even a shut-in. Offer an individual a warm greeting and a Merry Christmas holiday season. You may be surprised, as I was, at how much you will receive from the experience!

Merry Christmas everyone and may God work through each of you this holiday season and all year long!

Building Fund - This fund is for the Faith We Build Campaign, which pays the mortgage for the Family Life Center.



church, and we thank you!








CHURCH AND SOCIETY ANGEL TREE

Thank-Offering Tea Given by the Women in Faith

The Thank-Offering Tea was hosted by the Women in Faith on Saturday, November 15, 2025, at the Zion Methodist Community Church Library. There were close to 30 ladies in attendance. The guest speaker was Martha Hailey-Jones from the Isaiah 117 House.

The Isaiah House 117 is a place for children who are being placed in foster care. Close your eyes and think about a child who has just gone through a tragedy and lost both their parents. First, they would be with police officers, then a social worker who would put them in a corner of their office. There might be some toys, paper, and a few crayons. The child is scared, does not know anyone, and is being told to sit there and be quiet for minutes, hours, or up to 48 hours until the case worker finds them a place to stay. What Isaiah House 117 does is try to make this process a little less traumatic and easier for that child. At Isaiah House 117, the case worker has an office to work in, and personal caregivers are available to attend to the child's needs. There are snacks, drinks, toys, and a room with a bed for sleeping. If they want to go outside to play, there is a playground. They also get new clothes in their size, which they take with them to their new living place. Isaiah House 117 is located in Butler and is the first of its kind in the state of Pennsylvania.

We learned a great deal about this program and how we can support these children, either as a group or individually, by donating, serving as a sock buddy or bin buddy, or volunteering. The speaker, Martha Hailey-Jones, was very informative, and the food and fellowship were a blessing for all of us who attended. Thank you, Women in Faith.



Ingredients


1 head of broccoli chopped into florets

Ingredients

2 packages (8 ounces each) cream cheese, softened

1 tablespoon finely chopped onion
1 tablespoon diced pimientos
1 tablespoon diced green pepper
2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
1 teaspoon lemon juice
Chopped pecans, toasted
Assorted crackers



Directions

In a large bowl, combine the first 7 ingredients. Shape into 2 balls; roll in pecans. Cover and refrigerate. Remove from the refrigerator 15 minutes before serving. Serve with crackers.
